

Happy Tails Begin Here



Building on the momentum of previous years, the FLIGHTS team has worked extensively throughout 2025 with our international partners in Ireland, Australia, and the UK, ensuring that retiring greyhounds have every opportunity to enjoy a happy and comfortable life here in Canada. Our partnerships have strengthened significantly, and we are proud to say that greyhounds from each of these regions are now finding their way to new homes across Ontario, Prince Edward Island, and Quebec.

After forming a new partnership with a UK greyhound group in 2024, this year marked the exciting beginning of welcoming UK greyhounds into Canada for retirement. Their arrival has been a wonderful milestone and a testament to the trust our international partners place in us.

FLIGHTS remains the first group in Canada to have formal agreements and now has three active international initiatives dedicated to rehoming retired greyhounds. This is a remarkable achievement and a testament to the hard work, passion, and dedication of the entire FLIGHTS team.

FLIGHTS Team Member Spotlight: TINA!

As 2025 draws to a close, it's the perfect moment to reflect on the remarkable journey of Tina, President and Founder of FLIGHTS – Finding Loving International Greyhounds Homes Together & Salukis, whose work has transformed the lives of sighthounds and their families across Canada and beyond.

Founded in 2015 under the umbrella of Greyhound Trust & Alliance (GT&A), FLIGHTS quickly became a beacon for retired Irish greyhounds seeking loving homes. With GT&A's deep roots in southwestern Ontario and decades of volunteer experience, the organization built a robust network dedicated to the welfare of these extraordinary dogs.

Tina's vision and leadership have been instrumental in FLIGHTS' growth. In 2021, the mission expanded to include salukis and saluki-crosses from the Middle East, marking the transition to FLIGHTS – Finding Loving Irish Greyhounds Homes Together and Salukis. This broadened scope brought new partnerships and nearly doubled placements year over year, thanks to the tireless support of volunteers and partner groups.

FLIGHTS' impact reached new heights in 2019, when collaboration with Greyhound Pets of America – National (GPA National) enabled thousands of retired Irish greyhounds to find homes in the United States. The organization's commitment to promoting sighthounds as loving companions has never wavered, and its work with partners in Doha has helped Middle Eastern salukis find their forever families in Ontario.

A major milestone arrived in 2023, as FLIGHTS began welcoming retired Australian greyhounds to Canada – becoming the first group in the country to establish strong foundations with both Ireland and Australia for international adoptions. This year, FLIGHTS celebrated another first: the arrival of British Racing greyhounds retiring in Canada.

Beyond FLIGHTS, Tina's commitment to sighthounds extends to running Happy Houndz Sighthound Boarding, a specialized sitting service that offers a warm, home-like environment for sighthounds whose owners are away. Understanding the unique needs of retired racers, Tina ensures every dog receives the care and comfort they deserve. As we look back on a decade of progress, it's clear that Tina and FLIGHTS have set new standards for sighthound advocacy and adoption. Their unwavering dedication continues to inspire, bringing hope and happiness to countless dogs and families.

Advancing Veterinary Diagnostics

FLIGHTS is currently supporting an exciting project with VitalBio aimed at advancing veterinary diagnostic testing. Recognizing the unique characteristics of greyhound blood, the team is ensuring these samples are included to improve test accuracy and relevance.

As an initial step, the project will review a small set of greyhound blood samples, which is processed within 24 hours of collection to maintain testing integrity. VitalBio is based in Oakville, Ontario, and will work with partners operating across the GTA.

Looking ahead, this collaboration is expected to expand, with additional greyhound samples likely needed as the work progresses. FLIGHTS is enthusiastic about the potential to establish an ongoing partnership with both VitalBio and the Canadian Animal Blood Bank to support future innovation in veterinary diagnostics.

About VitalBio

VitalBio is building a new era of diagnostics to make care radically accessible.

VitalBio is transforming how we think about health. We are on a mission to prevent disease, to reduce inequality of wellbeing, to redistribute control to patients, and empower healthcare providers in creating better outcomes. Every breakthrough we develop opens up a new world, and sets the stage for our next innovation. We're in it for the long haul — our initial products will change how we deliver care to our most vulnerable, then will evolve to preventative health for all.



Each blood donation can make a difference in the lives of three other dogs across Canada. **Does your pet have what it takes to be a hero? Join the Pack!**

Why You Should Donate

Just like humans, dogs need blood too! The Canadian Animal Blood Bank collects blood from healthy donors to transfuse into critically ill animals across Canada. Each day, ill and injured animals rely on transfusion therapy. From cancer therapy support to surgery and times of trauma, each donation can make a difference in the lives of three other dogs.

Benefits of Donating

Dogs like to help. It's in their blood! You will be proud that your participation in this unique activity will support other dogs' recovery of illness or injury, as well as your dog receives:

- One complimentary blood product for each unit of blood donated, should the need ever arise.
- Free microchip identification
- Bandana & blood donor tag
- Milestone dog tags every 5 donations
- Complimentary testing for blood-borne diseases and heartworm

Dogs have blood types?

Just like people, dogs have different blood types too! We type for the Dog Erythrocyte Antigen (DEA) 1 Negative and Positive. Only 40% of all dogs have the blood type DEA 1 Negative and they should ONLY receive Negative blood if they are in need.

Demand for the DEA 1 Negative blood type is very high. In an emergency, this blood type can be given to any dog which is why they are considered to be a universal donor. This means our supply of DEA 1 Negative is often low. We are looking for more dogs to join the pack, especially those that are more likely to have a negative blood type.

Whether your dog is DEA 1 Positive or DEA 1 Negative, every donation matters and helps to save the lives of dogs across Canada.

Some dog breeds that are more likely to be DEA 1 Negative include: Airedale Terrier, American Bulldog, Cane Corso, Doberman, Dogue de Bordeaux, English Bull Terrier, German Shorthaired Pointer, Greyhound, German Shepherd Dog, Irish Wolfhound, Lurcher, Newfoundland, Old English Sheepdog, Pit Bull, Great Pyrenees, Siberian Husky, Standard Poodle, Weimaraner



What are blood products used for?

Blood Products are primarily used to support dogs with conditions like:

- Cancer therapy support
- Rat Poison Toxicity
- Immune-Mediated Diseases
- Surgery and Times of Trauma
- Anemia, Parvovirus, and more!

Why do we Microchip?



All Greyhounds in Ireland, Australia & Great Britain have a mandatory chip implanted at a young age. This means that all FLIGHTS greyhounds will come chipped, but many will not be officially registered by the owners.

The chips have been tested and can be read in both Canada and the USA. Adopters are encouraged to register their pets so that their contact information is on record if their pet is ever lost or stolen.

A microchip, together with PetLink gives your pet a silent voice and gives owners peace of mind that your beloved pet will always find its way home.

Pet Chip Registry is dedicated to the well-being and safe return of your pet if lost!

PetLink is the cornerstone of Datamars' 24/7/365 pet registry and pet recovery service. Microchipping is the only unique, unalterable, tamper-proof, permanent form of identification that owners can provide for pets.

Please ensure both your Veterinarian and City By-law have your pet's microchip information on file.



Emergency Greyhound Care Plan

Having a care plan in place for your greyhound(s) is crucial, especially in the event of a human emergency. It is recommended to print and complete the emergency greyhound care form. Display it in a visible location in your home so that it can be easily found when needed.

The form should include details on who will take care of your greyhounds and any other pets you may have. It's also a good idea to have a conversation with family, friends, and neighbors to make sure they are willing and able to take care of your greyhound if an emergency arises. Additionally, consider placing a poster in your front window to inform people that pets are inside, ensuring that your greyhound will be cared for if you are unable to do so.

While we all hope that the worst never happens, it's important to think ahead about what you would like to happen with your greyhounds if you were to become ill, hospitalized, or pass away.

In case emergency care becomes permanent, we encourage caregivers to reach out to FLIGHTS so that our team can support the family and possibly return the greyhounds into our care.

Thank you for taking the time to consider and prepare for the safety of your greyhounds. Your proactive steps can make a significant difference in the well-being of your beloved pets.




This checklist will help you be prepared in the event of an emergency or natural disaster in your area.

EMERGENCY PLANNING CHECKLIST

Pets are part of our household. During an emergency situation, it is important to know how to keep our

- Prepare an emergency plan that covers the major disasters which have the potential to impact your family, including your greyhounds.
 - My plan covers fire, food and
- Ensure grass is kept mown low around kennel blocks, yards, exercise runs and other areas where your greyhounds spend time on your property.
 - Regularly remove rubbish and other garden waste from around your property to reduce fire hazards.
- Ensure your greyhounds always have a water supply that will last them several days, even if you expect to be home that evening. Water containers must be unsplittable.
- Choose a trusted neighbor, family member, or friend and give them a key to your home in case you need to access your greyhounds.
- Prepare a list of preferred boarding kennels, hotels, or shelters, or friends that would be prepared to temporarily house and care for your greyhounds in case of an emergency.
- Check with your local council for a list of evacuation or relief centers.

We are happy to send out a tag and add your pups to our list (and hopefully, we will never have to use it!).
